THE CONSTRUCTIVE CONSERVATISM OF EMPEROR CHARLES IV ON THE BASIS OF THE CASE OF THE ARCHBISHOPRIC OF COLOGNE IN 1372

This short contribution illustrates on the basis of an example, Emperor Charles IV's policy of strenghtening his power by reviving old traditions. In 1372 he invested two knights with an *advocatia*. These knights were the Masters of Wersterholt with their seat in the Westphalien section of the Archbishopric of Cologne. The property which went with *advocatia* had long since been alienated. The impression of stronger imperial influence and control was underlined by the Emperor's repeated interference in *Landfrieden* and *Freistühle* affairs in Westphalia thereafter.
