

HISTORY OF THE BOHEMIAN LANDS: NEW CONDITIONS FOR A FIELD OF RESEARCH

This was the title of a conference at Bad Wiessee in November 1990, which was reported on in *Bohemia* 31/2 (1991), pp. 379–381. Some of the contributions presented at this conference were published in the *Bulletin Historického ústavu ČAV*, Nos. 1–5 (Dec. 27, 1990); another four appear in this issue of *Bohemia*. *Ferdinand Seibt's* contribution deals with new topics, new sources, and new prospects, and evolves possible frameworks for future international cooperation among the historians of the Bohemian lands; *Georg G. Iggers* places the question of national history and historical science in the context of contemporary developments in historiography; *Harry Hanak* and *Stanley B. Winters* report on developments taking place in Great Britain and the US respectively.
